

LITTLE FIREFACE FARMERS

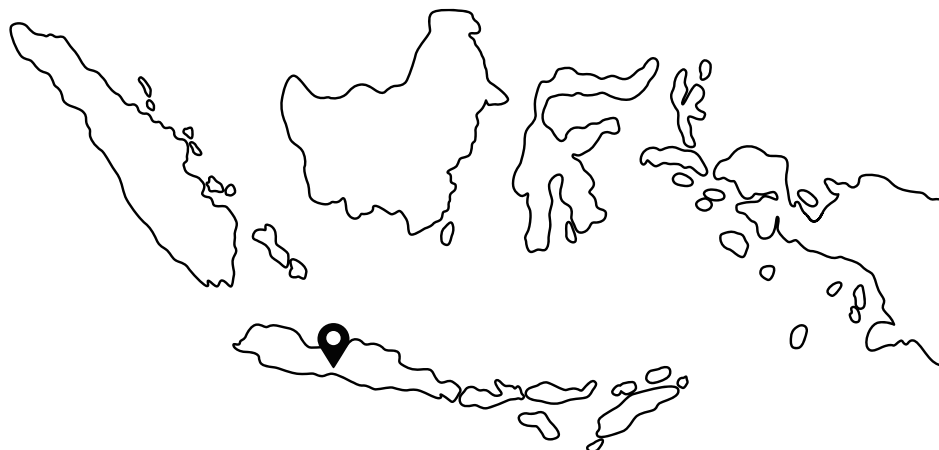
Led by Professor Anna Nekaris OBE, the Little Fireface Project Wildlife Friendly Coffee Program works with local farmers from Cipaganti and Pangauban to promote and encourage the use of nature-positive farming practices within the coffee farms, which the Javan slow loris calls home.

This hand-picked Arabica coffee is cultivated in home gardens, covering an area of 60 ha. These gardens are connected to the Gunung Papandayan Protected Forest. The farmers received extensive training from the government on organic practices, coffee processing, and roasting. A group of around 30 farmers also started a process of obtaining organic certification in 2016 and received the certification ORGANIK Indonesia from ICERT in 2019.

Grown at 1450 masl under the shade of native canopy.

Interconnected with other types of crop gardens, including tea and chayote, coffee is often planted together with understory crops (e.g., cassava, chili) and shade trees.

These farming practices participate in reinforcing the resilience of the ecosystem where these farms are located.

TRADITIONAL COFFEE CULTIVATION

Wildlife Friendly™ Coffee is cultivated using age-old techniques that conserve both tradition and the environment. Farmers use the natural processing method, where the coffee fruit remains on the bean as it dries, allowing its rich flavors to develop.

From Farm to Cup

As of 2024, Certified Wildlife Friendly™ coffee can be found in Europe through Kindred Forest, a company committed to sustainability and conservation.

Kindred Forest offers ethically sourced, single-origin products, working directly with indigenous communities in Indonesia.

A portion of their profits supports the Little Fireface Project's efforts in West Java.



COFFEE, COEXISTENCE, AND BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION

The Cipaganti coffee gardens play a crucial role in conserving the Gunung Papandayan Protected Forest and its wildlife.

Shade-grown coffee maintains native tree canopies, which provide habitat for countless species, including birds, pollinators, and the Javan slow loris, a key endangered species of the region. These agroforestry systems mimic natural forests, offering a refuge for wildlife while maintaining soil health and minimizing deforestation, which contributes to enhancing climate resilience of the region.
